Annual Picnic, Tuesday, July 3 at Indian Riffle Park in Kettering

DIRECTIONS: Donna Gehring checked it out thoroughly and, yes, the skatepark, Indian Riffle Park, is spelled RIFFLE even though the road nearby is RIPPLE. Traveling south on Stroop from the intersection of Indian Ripple, Dorothy Lane and Stroop Roads reset your tripometer to 0.0. This is a divided highway. At about 0.8 miles just this side of Bethany Church of Christ on the right there is an entrance. There are signs, but they are not helpful at all from the southbound side of the street. If you pass the church, you have gone too far. Turn around and go north. The signs are more visible.

If you are traveling north on Stroop from the intersection of Stroop and Woodman reset your tripometer. It is 0.8 miles from this intersection to your entrance on the left side of the road. It is the next street just north of Bethany Church of Christ on the left. We are in picnic shelter #3.
