Wildcat Hollow Trail Maintenance

Four of us camped at Burr Oak Cove camp Friday night. We were met by 2 others and the Forest Service Tec's. complete with back hoes and off-road dump truck. After a quick safety meeting and a sign up, we were off to Monroe High Point to work on the scenic overlook, located on Irish Ridge Road near Corning Ohio. The back hoe carved the path, and the volunteers, followed up and dressed the edges, to prep for the gravel base. Several hundred feet of GEO ground cloth was cut, to control weeds in the gravel foot path. Several large rocks caused one volunteer to work endlessly to remove the rock. This rock will forever more, remain a marker at the top of the hill. Benches are already in place, at the top of the hill, with information sign to follow shortly. A four place parking pull off is already finished. Other volunteer groups, including the local high school seniors worked Thursday and Friday.

The weather was very nice for our day of work outdoors, we finished our work about 4 in the afternoon. Most went home, but I stayed for 2 more days to hunt mushrooms, found 80 to 100

Cedar Bog Nature Preserve

Sunday, April 26

On this unseasonably warm, breezy, sunny day a half dozen MVOCers were treated to a guided tour through the first nature preserve in Ohio purchased with state money. In 1802 surveyors considered the area an impenetrable swamp. The first president of Urbana college was the first scientist to investigate the wetland. In 1942 the state purchased the first one hundred acres of this Natural National Landmark. Dave and Virginia Wood, Bonnie Spitzkeit, Jeanne Boeke, Mike Nelson and Lindy McDonough followed the park naturalist through the springtime landscape along a boardwalk that mean-

dered through woods, swamp, open wetland, savannah and prairie habitats. We were warned that by stepping off the boardwalk we might sink into four feet of muck. The huge leaves of maturing skunk cabbage covered the forest floor in places for as far as the eye could see. Blooming wildflowers were everywhere and while crossing an expanse of open wetland we spotted a striped water snake about as big around as a pencil near the boardwalk. Later a few of us saw a skink (yes, scaly not furry) scurry around the trunk of a large tree. Some of us plan to return to see the changing flora throughout the year. Visiting this unique natural treasure was well worth the trip.
